Description

The goal of Music Theory III is to expand your knowledge of common-practice tonal music beyond the diatonic worlds learned in Theories I and II. You will be introduced to the various chromatic harmonies of the style throughout the semester, and will also begin learning the possibilities of modulation. By the end of this course, you should be familiar with the vast majority of all harmonies and key areas you will encounter in Baroque, Classical and Romantic tonal music.
